Administration Officers support the daily operations of Sunshine Coast Health. They assist with patient admissions, manage medical records, schedule appointments, and support the smooth operation of healthcare services. Their role ensures efficient communication and coordination between patients, staff and departments/wards.

A School Based Traineeship offers the opportunity for students to kick start their career whilst continuing their Year 11 and 12 studies.

What are the benefits of a School Based Traineeship?

- Hands on experience working in a real-world environment.
- Receive points towards your Year 12 Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE).
- Contributes toward your Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR) (you do not need to be ATAR eligible to apply for a traineeship).
- Real job opportunities at the end of your traineeship.

Are you the right person for the job?

To be successful in gaining a school based traineeship your application needs to demonstrate these personal attributes:

- A current Year 10 student with the ability to commit to a 2-year school based traineeship across Year 11 and Year 12 this means you need to have the skills, ability and selfmotivation to work towards completing a Certificate III in Administration Officer prior to finishing your school education and attend the workplace one day per week.
- Willingness to learn if you are successful in applying for this position, you will be assigned an 'on-the-job supervisor'. Your supervisor will show you how to perform tasks, assign you tasks to complete and assess your workplace competency.
- A genuine interest in Health completing a school based traineeship will allow you the opportunity to explore your pathway into a career in Health.

How does a school based traineeship work?

You will attend your traineeship placement at a Sunshine Coast Health facility one day per week (Monday to Friday), on the same day each week. This means you will miss a day of normal schooling each week. Following a selection process you will become an employee of a Group Training Organisation (GTO) who provide the legal/insurance cover required. You will be required to manage your school workload, theoretical workload and on-the-job practical training and complete the required theoretical learning through a Registered Training Organisation (RTO).

How do I apply?

STEP 1 – Talk to your parents, your school (VET coordinator) and your teachers about this fantastic opportunity and why you would like to apply for this traineeship with Sunshine Coast Health.

STEP 2 – Ensure you are able get to your nominated Sunshine Coast Health facility one day per week

Initial applications will be assessed based on your home location in relation to the selected facility. You should only select the traineeship at the facility within your school's catchment area.

STEP 3 - Complete the application form

The following information is required as part of the application form;

Your personal details and the details of your parent/guardian, your reason for applying, your interest in a health career, skills you have gained through part time work, volunteering, hobbies or sporting endeavours and a healthcare related quiz.
