Placement Details

Acute Medical Unit AMU is a 64-bed general medical unit providing patient-centred, evidence-based care from admission to discharge to a diverse range of medical patients with undifferentiated, single or multi system diagnosis. This includes but is not limited to:

- Respiratory infections e.g., pneumonia, Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD), asthma
- Other infections e.g., urinary tract infections, septicaemia
- Heart failure and shock
- 5B Butterfly Wing: Eating and obsessive-compulsive disorders.
- 5C Seaview: Dementia, delirium, and cognitive impairment

The AMU delivers comprehensive inpatient and outpatient services through a multidisciplinary team-based model of care, led by consultants and interacting with all services across the care continuum, to provide:

- Medical management of presenting acute/chronic illness
- Rapid, high level patient assessment and discharge planning
- Early management and discharge of patients into the community
- Early identification of patients requiring longer stay in hospital for medical and/or psychosocial reasons.
- Early identification and referral of patients requiring sub-specialist input and management.

Learning Objectives/Opportunities

There are many learning opportunities available for students, below are some that can be achieved while on placement (with consideration of the student's scope of practice):

- Admission and discharge of patients
- Care planning, time management and prioritisation skills





- Teamwork and communication skills including escalation of care.
- Clinical handover and communicating with the multi-disciplinary team (MDT)
- Activities of Daily Living (ADLs)
- Deeper understanding of the patient journey through the Hospital and Health Service (HHS)
- Patient assessment skills
- Pre and post procedure care, observations, and management
- Specialist cognitive assessment and management of behavioural and psychological symptoms of cognitive impairment
- Communicating with the highly confused elderly patient
- Wound care simple and complex (including Vacuum Assisted Closure (VAC) dressings)
- Medication management Oral, subcutaneous, intramuscular, and intravenous
- Complex discharge planning with a multidisciplinary team case conference goal-based care model
- Caring for patients with multiple co-morbidities
